



THE PROBLEM

Chicago's population has been in freefall over the past 70 years, losing nearly one million residents, leading the US in population decline. Chicago was once the center of US industry and innovation. What happened?

The answer is simple: a lack of opportunity. Technology is by far the fastest growing industry in the United States with hundreds of thousands of unfilled jobs and employers desperate for talent—but nearly all of the opportunities are on the coasts. In 2017 alone, there were 30 hackathons for high school students hosted in California with thousands of students in attendance. In the entire Midwest, there were only 4, the largest of which was hosted by us.

The internet was supposed to remove geography from the equation, but now it feels more limiting than ever. The only way to end the brain drain and revitalize our city is to provide avenues to expose students to programming—starting with Hack Chicago.

THE SOLUTION

Hack Chicago will be the largest high school hackathon the Midwest has ever seen—an event that will connect 500 students of all skill levels, in a weekend of collaboration and innovation. Participants will have 24 hours to build an app, website, or game based on a single theme. After the time is up, participants and judges will select the winning projects and teams.
